IRT College operates within the guidelines of the IRT College and IRT Group policies and procedures. Our courses require English language, literacy and numeracy skills appropriate to the course level. Courses may be offered on a first in basis where a maximum number of enrolments apply. Priority of course entry is made to IRT employees. Note that specific government subsidised programs may have entry/eligibility requirements that IRT College must comply with.

**IRT College reserves the right to cancel a course if insufficient enrolments are received. Should IRT College cancel a course, 100% of fees paid will be refunded. Late enrolments may be accepted at the discretion of IRT College. Course dates and fees are subject to change without prior notice.**
